## Advent Matters

What follows are the Gospel readings for the Church's season of Advent.

Read Matthew 24:36-44 – Sunday, December 1

This portion of Scripture may seem to some inappropriate just before Christmas. At its best Advent is two things: a look back, and a look forward.

An apocalypse is a story of a showdown. The battle is on between good and evil, between God and the Devil. Jesus brought salvation the first time. When Jesus comes back, evil will lose for the last time, and God wins.

So the Church says: May he come soon.

Read Matthew 3:1-12– Sunday, December 8

These first few verses of Matthew's Gospel feature John the Baptist, whose whole ministry was to "Prepare the way of the Lord." It is important to know that the religious people of the time were not ready for Christ to be born in Bethlehem. It is for us to be ready for Christ to come again.

So the Church says: He is coming, soon.

Read Matthew 11:2-11 – Sunday, December 15

These verses are meant to provide scriptural clues to the identity of Jesus. He is the one who can do things only God could do. He is the one predicted. He is the one to prepare the way.

So the Church says: May he come soon.

Read Matthew 1:18-25 – Sunday, December 18

Jesus came the first time in a completely mistakable way. Born to poor parents, in an obscure town, in a stable no less. The second time will be more obvious, especially to those who are ready and looking. May he come soon.

So now the Church tries to do what John the Baptist did: Prepare the way of the Lord.

On Christmas Eve and Christmas day one part of Advent is over, one part remains.

### Zion Lutheran's Parish Planning Council Minutes November 19, 2019

The Parish Planning Council meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 5:32 pm. In attendance were Laura Rude, Pastor John Golv, Pastor Ale Tulu, Tim Numedahl, Bonnie Yost, Barbara Overbye, Madison Crane, Dennis Yost, Penni Nelson, Jodi Bergman, Lindsay Henrickson, Glenice Johnson, Sharon Jorde, Mike Spears and Deb Holtan.

Pastor Ale opened with a word of prayer.

The minutes from the October 15, 2019 meeting were presented. A motion was made to accept the minutes. The motion was approved.

**Treasures Report:** The budget is behind just over \$46,000.00. Barbara pointed out that last October we had a nice boost in income. Looking back at the council minutes, there was a Miracle Sunday during October of last year that brought in just over \$19,000.00.

The report was filed for audit.

**Silver Creek:** Penni Nelson said the winner of their quilt raffle was Pam Battleson. Silver Creeks Christmas Eve service will be at 5:30 on the 24th.

**Stewardship:** Dennis Yost reported that 92 pledges have been turned in so far compared to 81 pledges in 2018. There is between \$4,000.00 and \$5,000.00 more pledged this year than last year. Dennis stated that he felt this year's Stewardship Program was more up beat and positive and that he's heard a lot of positive feedback on the Temple Talks that were made. Overall he was pleased and hopes to build more on the program for next year. There is still a plan to go forward with calling members to put forth an invitation to



upcoming events at the church. The board is looking for volunteers to help with the calling. Also the board is looking for anyone that is interested in being on the Stewardship board, as there are only two members as of now. Discussion was also held on what kind of fundraisers could be done to help with the church's budget.

**Worship:** Sharon Jorde submitted her report highlighting that Deb Fulton will be contacting families for the Advent candle lighting and readings.

**Properties:** The board will be meeting on the Friday after Thanksgiving to put up the Christmas trees. The south wall in the sanctuary that had water damage from the heavy rains this fall has been repaired and painted.

**Evangelism and Lay Ministry:** Deb Holtan reported on the board's minutes from Marijo Nabben. New Member Sunday will be January 12th at the second service with a potluck to follow. The "Community of Gifts" sheets were handed out to the appropriate boards to utilize the information based on how it was filled out.

**Christian Ed and Youth:** Lindsay Henrickson reported that the board had met with Madison Crane and discussed what she will be responsible for and what the Sunday School Superintendents, Becky Frederickson and Davina Brown, are responsible for and what falls under the duties of the board. A couple of the upcoming events for K-5 will be Ornament making on Sunday November 24th from 1:00-3:00 pm. December's event will be "Happy Birthday Jesus" with a tentative date of Sunday December 8<sup>th</sup> after the Christmas program. Events for the 6-12th graders are still being planned. The next "Flapjacks for Faith" will be December 15th.

**Director of Children, Youth and Families:** Madison Crane submitted her report. She is generally on Mondays and Wednesdays at Redeemer. Tuesdays and Thursdays she is at Zion and Fridays she will split and be at both churches, or where she is needed more. Madison stated that she is busy learning each of the congregation's history with the youth and learning about the different committees and groups each of the churches have.

**Parish Fellowship:** Glenice Johnson reported there were 25-30 people that attended the "Pie with the Bishop." The Pie and Dessert Auction will be Sunday November 24th between the services. The larger donations will be reflected on the winning bidder's contribution statement. Christmas Caroling will take place on Sunday, December 15 starting at 4:30 pm. The carolers will go to Valley Home, TRF Care Center, Oakland Park and to Greenleaf. They are encouraging the youth to participate. There is still a need for leaders for the December Sharing Servants Group. Parish Fellowship will be filling in for the month of December. Glenice feels that some of the coffee servers between services might be intimidated as to what they are supposed to do. A list is being put together and will be posted in the kitchen. The "Training Ears to Hear" has been cancelled.

**WELCA/ZLCW:** Glenice Johnson reported that in early November the WELCA/ZLCW shipped out 28 quilts, 98 personal care kits, 54 school kits, and 31 baby care kits. The ladies will be serving coffee and refreshments after the joint Thanksgiving Eve service. The 2020 WELCA booklets are updated and ready for pickup. They will not be mailed this year. Ladies are to pick them up in the narthex. SAM (Synodically Authorized Ministry) will have a training meeting on December 14th from 11:00-2:00 here at Zion with WELCA serving their lunch. The WELCA Christmas Tea will be Tuesday December 14th from 10:00-2:00. Leftover cookies from the tea are packaged up and brought to be served when the Christmas Train comes through Thief River Falls. Glenice asked that the dishwasher in the kitchen be looked at and possibly serviced.

**Public Relations:** Jodi Bergman reported the board did not meet. The ads for Spirit of Giving have been placed.

**Semi Annual Meeting:** President Laura Rude asked for discussion on moving the Semi Annual Meeting that is usually the last Sunday in June, moving it to some time in September. There has been an ongoing concern that because it is during the summer months that there are enough members in attendance to have a quorum. Laura said Redeemer has moved theirs to September. After some discussion, Dennis Yost proposed a motion that the Semi Annual meeting be moved from June to September. The motion was seconded and carried.

**Pastor Ale's Report:** Pastor Ale stated he had nothing else to report.

**Pastor John's Report:** Pastor John submitted his report. He stated that there will be eight pastors involved with the Thanksgiving Eve service that will be held here at Zion on November 27th at 7:00.

**Spirit of Giving:** Bonnie Yost reported that several businesses are donating clothing; along with Social Services donating some quilts. Bonnie reminded the council that Spirit of Giving is Saturday December 7<sup>th</sup>.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 after saying the Lord's Prayer.
