PARISH HEALTH



Our new LIFEPAC CR2 AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is ready to go and placed in its cabinet across from the elevator. It is the latest version and the features available and how it works are very impressive!

Tim Cook from the Sanford TRF Ambulance service has been here to link the AED with a service called LIFENET System. When the AED is used, the hospital or other facilities that have this system can access it and see the heart rhythm

and all that was done while it was being used. This system also can monitor the battery life and checks on it regularly, an emails will be sent if any problems are detected. We will continue to monitor it as well.

Some quick points about its use......

When opening the cabinet to get the AED, a very LOUD alarm goes off and this is to let people know it is being accessed and the AED may be needed somewhere, go to see if help is needed. Closing the door shuts the alarm off.

It has 60 voice prompts so just follow them and you can't go wrong, it'll correct you or reprompt you. Take some deep breaths and you will do an amazing job! Closing the lid shuts the machine off.

There is only one set of pads to be used for all ages and they are connected to the AED already, just need to connect to the person and change the mode to a child if needed. A child is considered less than 8 yrs old or 55 lbs.

Lay person CPR does not include ventilations, only compressions. There is a metronome sound to follow for the rate of compression and is set for 104 a minute. It will want to check a rhythm every 2 minutes and will prompt you to stop CPR for that. DO NOT TOUCH THE PATIENT during this time. It will say that, follow the instructions. It'll give a shock if needed and say so. If anyone is touching the person during that time, they would be shocked too. Successful defibrillation occurs around 80% after the first shock given if done ASAP or within the first 9 minutes. It has saved many lives since placed in public areas outside of the hospital.

If you'd like to watch a short training video on it's use, go to www.physio-control.com and check it out. I will be trying to get to most groups before January to give a short presentation on its use, including during our fellowship hour after church today.

Let's pray we never get to find out how good it works because we have NOT had to use it. Stay warm, God's Blessing and Peace be with you today and always.

Gift Suggestions:

TOYS or a "WOW" item: Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring, and picture books, etc.

PERSONAL CARE ITEMS: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, adhesive bandages (Colorful ones can help a child be more willing to wear a bandage. Do not include liquid anti-biotic ointment.), Reusable plastic containers: cup, water bottle, plate, bowl, (Consider filling an empty container with non-liquid items such

as hair bows, bracelets, sunglasses, or washcloths to maximize the space.) blanket, non-liquid lip balm, nail clipper and file, etc.

CLOTHING & ACCESSORIES: t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

CRAFTS & ACTIVITIES: Puzzles, Binoculars, Compass, Chalkboard, and chalk, Sewing kit, fabric (1-2 yards), and ribbon, Laminated decorative pictures with looped ribbon attached as a picture hanger, Gardening kit with gloves and trowel hand tool (Do not include gardening seeds.), Playing cards, Skipping rope/Jump rope

A PERSONAL NOTE: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

Shoe boxes will be available starting the week of October 9th. We will also have totes for you to drop off your donations.

We ask that all shoe boxes be turned back into the church by *Monday, November 14th. (tomorrow)*
