#### **Pastor Mark's Missive**

#### **History of Thanksgiving**

It is commonly accepted that the first Thanksgiving was celebrated in 1621.

This feast was attended by both Pilgrims and Indians who joined together to thank God for their bountiful harvest of the previous year. This tradition was continued by the first American colonies, and later by the United States, as a time of thanksgiving for the blessings that God had bestowed upon the American people.

History tells us that the official holiday of Thanksgiving was started when Abraham Lincoln, near the end of the Civil War, asked Americans to set aside the last Thursday of November as a day of thanksgiving to God for the blessings He had shown to America.

However, some historians will remind us that the very first U. S. president to proclaim a national day of Thanksgiving was John Hanson. Who was President John Hanson, you ask? John Hanson was the first president of congress under the Articles of Confederation. (There was no Executive Branch, no Judicial Branch and only one deliberative body – Congress) President Hanson took office just a month after the surrender of General Lord Cornwallis at Yorktown. Hanson organized the Department of Foreign Affairs, which would be necessary to negotiate peace with Great Britain. It

was at this crucial moment that President Hanson and Congress stopped to reflect on the successful progress of the American War of Independence, with Hanson issuing a proclamation of Thanksgiving, the first under an American government. The document was signed, March 19, 1782, in Philadelphia, and signed by John Hanson, President of Congress and by Charles Thomson as Secretary of Congress.

"Proclamation: The goodness of the Supreme Being to all his rational creatures demands their acknowledgments of gratitude and love; his absolute government of this world dictates that it is the interest of every nation and people ardently to supplicate his favor and implore his protection...

"The United States in Congress assembled, [acknowledging God's] past acts of kindness and goodness towards us... call upon the several States to set apart the last Thursday in April next as a day of fasting, humiliation, and prayer, that our joint supplications may then ascend to the throne of the Ruler of the universe..."

To be sure this was a call to the thirteen newly independent states to be thankful in April, (which didn't catch on) but it was a proclamation for national thanksgiving none-the-less. Americans of every generation have had a profound sense of God's leading, blessing and protecting this country.

Thanksgiving is clearly a national holiday, and it doesn't really matter when it began. Just because it isn't a "pure" holy day of our faith, such as Christmas and Easter, doesn't mean that we shouldn't celebrate it. There were political overtones in 1621 (the pilgrims were thankful that they were no longer living in England). There were political overtones in 1782 (General Cornwallis had just surrendered to General Washington, and the terrible war of independence was won).

Later, after the Constitution was adopted, a resolution was passed in the new Congress, thus President George Washington proclaimed Thursday the 26th of November 1789 a day of "public thanksgiving and prayer."

There were also political overtones in 1864 when President Lincoln gave his Thanksgiving proclamation (the Civil War was still raging).

And in 1941 when President Roosevelt proclaimed that the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday in November was to be a day of thanksgiving, war raged around the world

threatening to draw the United States in.

Indeed, this is the only secular/religious holiday on our Church calendar, so how should Christians celebrate Thanksgiving? Let's take time to offer to God heartfelt thanks.

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1Thess. 5:18)

Let us do all things to God's Glory!"





#### Zion Lutheran's Congregational Council Minutes Tuesday October 18, 2022

The Congregational Council Meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 4:30 pm. In attendance were President Laura Rude, Pastor Mark Helgeland, Denny Minks, Renae Franke, Penni Nelson, Marijo Nabben, Darlene Hulteen Deb Fulton, Glenice Johnson, Mike Spears, Patty Schob, spokesperson for the Health Committee and Deb Holtan.

Pastor Mark led the council in prayer.

The secretary's report from September 20, 2022, was presented. A motion was made to accept the minutes corrections with made in spelling and under the WELCA report Conference should be Convention. The motion was seconded. The motion carried.

Also presented were the minutes from the Special Council meeting held on Tuesday September 27, 2022. A motion was made to accept the minutes as printed. The motion was seconded and approved.

The Treasurer's Report was presented. Renae gave updates on the savings account and the Nelson CD's. Renae reported a correction to the August 31, 2022, report with the savings account has been corrected on the September 30, 2022, report. Linda Hamrick had concerns that the bank statements for the checking account didn't not correlate with Linda's records. The corrections were made by the bank as of October 12, 2022. The Nelson CD's will mature as of October 25. Other options are being considered for a better interest rate. A suggestion was made to talk to Jake Rantanen at Northern State Bank to see what options are available. The report was filed for audit.

A motion was made by Mike Spears to appoint Renae Franke to fill the vacant position of Treasurer until the next annual meeting. The motion was seconded by Marijo Nabben. The motion was approved.

Pastor Mark gave his report. Since the last council meeting, he has performed two baptisms, two weddings, six counseling sessions, no funerals, hospital visits, or home visits, also the Confirmation Retreat. He was to Fargo for a retired pastors meeting and then on to a Gideon's supper. Starting in November on Tuesdays, he and Darlene Wiseth will be going to the nursing homes in town to give communion. October 30th is Reformation Sunday and also Confirmation Sunday with nine students being confirmed. There are two students not able to attend that service, but a future date will be planned for those two for their confirmation. Pastor Mark made a motion to recommend the following students Tiera Bugge, Jace Erickson, Layla Forsberg, Keaton Hoverson, Braydin Lund, Julia Rude and Olivia Tougas to confirm their faith on October 30th. The motion was seconded and approved.

<u>Silver Creek:</u> Penni Nelson asked if their Christmas Eve Service could be held at 5:30 like last year. They are going back to the third Sunday of the month for their Communion Sunday. They had their dinner, and the quilt was raffled off. An initiation was extended to Silver Creek to attend services here at Zion on the 30th due to the confirmation service. With Christmas Day on a Sunday this year, Silver Creek will not be holding a service. On that note, Zion will have an alternative service on Christmas Day, which will be discussed at the next meeting.

<u>Health Committee:</u> Patty Schob submitted their report with the following interests pointed out. Darlene Wiseth completed the Parish Nurse Class with installation on October 16th. The new AED is here! Education on its use will be coming in the future. Also, monthly educational classes are being planned. The council discussed the Parish Nurse salary. There is a line item in the budget for the Parish Nurse. A motion was made to pay Darlene Wiseth for this year (2022) what is left in the budget for her work. The motion was seconded and carried.

<u>Call Committee:</u> Glenice Johnson reported at the upcoming congregational meeting only needs a two thirds majority of the whole that is present. Hoping everyone uses the honor system for their voting. It will be by paper ballot and counted during the meeting. The candidate will be reveled at that meeting.

<u>Properties:</u> Mike Spears reported that there will be a dumpster starting the week of the 24th which will be placed in the parking lot. The dumpster will be available for two weeks. So, any boards needing to "clean house" will

have an opportunity to do so. The underground wiring for the electronic sign will take place next week. The parking lot striping should be done this week. Mike mentions the property tax assessment on the two lots is approximately \$9,800.00. Also, the mysterious water leak in the kitchen has been solved!

<u>Stewardship:</u> Madam President stated she will draft a letter again this year. Pledge cards will be included with this letter. Temple talks will also take place starting in November up to Thanksgiving. Displays of where the church members giving goes to was discussed.

**Worship:** Deb Fulton submitted her report pointing out that All Saints Sunday is November 6th. Their board also discussed how expensive the shipping is getting on the orders for the eternity candle. Usually there are at least two candles that are broken during the shipment. There is an insert that uses oil. It was suggested that the board go ahead and order the oil candle insert. The rest of the altar candles and baptismal candle use oil also, so the oil is already available.

Evangelism and Lay Ministry: Marijo Nabben reported that New Member Sunday was held on October 9th with two families that were recognized, four adults and six children. Going along with the idea of a prayer vigil for fall, the board will be displaying a "Tree of Thanks". The board is asking that the people of Zion write on a leaf to be hung on the tree with what they are thankful for and sharing their blessings. The board will start helping with the membership list in the near future.

<u>Parish Fellowship:</u> Glenice Johnson reported that November's Sharing Servants now has a leader, but still looking for someone for the month of December. Her board has been filling in for that month. Glenice said she is going through the monthly lists doing a more detailed check, as it's been pointed out there are names that have been missed.

<u>WELCA:</u> Glenice Johnson reported that the pick-up date for all the mission kits will be Saturday November 5th, from 8:00 am to Noon on Atlantic Avenue. Help is needed to bring the packed boxes over to the pick-up sight. Sharon Wagner will be working with the confirmation students and packing the personal care kits.

<u>Public Relations:</u> Darlene Hulteen reported that her board has been discussing the church directory, which has been put on hold due to the

covid pandemic. The company that they have used before no longer does the directories. They have discussed two options. One is the actually directory book and the other is an online directory. Darlene stated that anyone can submit a photo for this project. Her board is recommending the printed version. Also, dates have been discussed so as to include the "snowbirds". The board is hoping to get dates for the upcoming year.

Youth and Christian Ed: The Sunday School has new curriculum. They have gone back to "Spark" The next Faith and Food breakfast will be Sunday November 20th which will also be the Desert and Pie Auction as well as the "65+ Thanksgiving Supper" Upcoming events for the kids are Northern Air in November and the Gingerbread House contest in December.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:09 pm following the Lord's Prayer.
