They shall build up the ancient ruins; they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. Isaiah 61:4

Traveling down first street in Thief River Falls the last weeks has been an exercise in patience. Cars have been slowing down as we all watch the old hospital come down piece by piece. Some of you have mentioned your children and grandchildren's birth in that old building. Others recall parents and grandparents tenderly cared for in the CNC. Still other speak of working in what is now a ruin.

It is always a bit sad to see structures that have come to have meaning in our lives fall into disuse, disrepair, or neglect. Our hearts are nudged by memories of so many people and moments shared. At the same time, we know that all things come to an end. Buildings in this place have a season, they can be repurposed, reconfigured, and even, as is the case of the hospital, torn down to make way for something new.

The people of God at the time of Isaiah were living as exiles hoping to return home and restore the glory of Israel. They were surrounded by ruins: a conquered kingdom, a captive people, broken families, pagan worship, and so much more. The words from the Prophet Isaiah to the people declared the incredible loss suffered by God's people would give way to a time of healing, a time when the kingdom and its glory would be restored.

I ponder the ruins that have devastated God's people for generations. We might think of ruins like alcoholism and drug addiction, racism, and

sexism. In Romans 8 St. Paul writes of the spirit of the flesh and the devastation of sin in our lives. We know that we don't live perfectly ordered lives, we experience sin and death each day.

Sin isn't something that we talk about. To be sure we confess our sins and turn to God for forgiveness. Yet so often these confessions are abstract we don't' like to look deep within ourselves to ponder how we might be called to change. I have heard some wonder why the hospital had to come down. From the outside, it looked as though it still had life. For so many of us, we live life like that old building- a little scarred on the outside with very little hint of how things truly are on the inside.

Looking at the consequences of sin honestly is to see the ruins on full display. It is painful and heartbreaking. It may cause us to feel shame. As far as change, the call to rebuild can be overwhelming. How is it that these ruins will be rebuilt, restored, and renewed?

We have a master craftsman, Christ Jesus our Savior and Lord. Jesus doesn't see with the same eyes we do. Jesus sees the sin, yes, but he sees it as his own. He takes our sin and carries it for us. He takes on all of it. For every sin on him was laid. The Son of God becomes a ruin on the cross, a devastation for the iniquities of every generation.

Yet in the death of Christ, the power of sin, death, and the devil were beaten. The ruins in our lives that bind our hearts and minds have no power over us. The hymn "In Christ Alone" explains is beautifully with these words: Then bursting forth in glorious day, up from the grave He rose again, and as He stands in victory, sin's curse has lost its grip on me, for I am His and He is mine, bought with the precious blood of Christ.

The cross of Christ is enough to set us free from every burden. We are entering the Easter Season, a time of resurrection, rebirth, and hope. The ancient ruins that bind us have been set aside and God in Christ Jesus is doing a new thing. What will be raised from the ashes of our past as we live into the future and beloved children of God?

Mental Health has become a growing crisis in our country and much improvement is needed especially for the youth. America's youth deserve appropriate well-informed and effective behavior health crisis



services. All too often children and youth who experience a behavioral health crisis face hospitalization or justice system involvement; instead of receiving the home-based care and community-based services that are in many circumstances best for de-escalating and stabilizing a crisis.

Between 2016-2020, the number of children aged 3-17 years diagnosed with anxiety grew by 29% and those with depression by 27% according to data from Health and Human Services. In 2020, suicide was the second leading cause of death for youth ages 10-14 and 25-34 and among the top leading cause of death for youth 10-16 years of age according to a report by HHS Center for Disease Control and Prevention.

New National Guidelines for Child and Youth Behavior Health Crisis Care has been developed. It recommends the least restrictive setting possible and if safe, at home and in the community. The goal is to partner with schools, family and peer support community organizations, child welfare and foster care, juvenile justice, pediatricians, and other primary providers along with law enforcement when appropriate.

St Paul, MN has recently opened our state's first youth 22 bed inpatient mental health hospital called Children's Minnesota. There is a great need for more of these facilities.

Anyone seeking treatment for mental health or substance use issues should call the SAMHSA National Helpline at 800-662-HELP (4357) or visit findtreatment.samhsa.gov If you or someone you know is struggling or in crisis, help is available. Call or text 988 or chat 988lifeline.org May God protect and guide our youth during these difficult years of their lives.

#### **Lutheran World Relief Projects**

Each year, Zion's WELCA group prepares and sends a variety of kits and quilts that are distributed world-wide and to disaster sites in the USA. Last month the "Personal Care Kits" materials were described, and Zion members have been generous with donations being collected during Lent. The box for donations will continue to be near the narthex steps until after Easter.

This month we are featuring the "Baby Care Kits" and throughout the year we collect or purchase the following items: lightweight cotton T-shirts, long or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet), receiving blankets (cotton, flannel or crocheted/knitted with light-weight yarn), cloth diapers, jackets or sweaters or sweatshirts with a hood or a cap, socks, hand towel (dark color preferred), bath-size bars of gentle soap, and diaper or large safety pins. The diapers can be purchased cotton diapers OR made by our WELCA members. We welcome donations of flannel fabric, used flannel sheets (any color or prints) or adult-sized T-shirts (can be any color, may have imprints on them, and primarily of cotton fabric).

Thank you for the generous donations of items for any of the LWR kits, fabric for diapers or for quilts, monetary gifts used to purchase kit items, and Thrivent cards from members, used for additional purchases.

Zion Lutheran's Congregational Council Minutes March 21, 2023

The Congregational Council Meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 5:33 p.m. In attendance were President Laura Rude, Pastor Kristin Ostercamp, Denny Minks, Diane Lee, Renae Franke, Clark Nelson, Mike Spears, Mike Flaagan, Glenice Johnson, Darlene Hulteen, Deb Fulton, Patty Schob, Deb Holtan and guest Darlene Wiseth.

Pastor Kristin led the council in devotion and prayer.

Zion's Faith Community Nurse, Darlene Wiseth demonstrated the new AED to the council.

The Secretary's Report from February 21, 2023 was presented. A motion to accept the minutes as printed with the correction made to the spelling of Mike Flaagan's last name was made. The motion was seconded and carried.

The Treasurer's Report was presented. The last payment to the sign company was made. The amount of \$20,112.74 was taken out of savings. Pastor Kristin questioned the dollar amounts in the remaining budget listed under continuing education. Looking at the report there were a couple more dollar amounts in the remaining budget that didn't print correctly. Renae will make the corrections to the report and present to the council at the next meeting. The Treasurer's Report was filed for audit.

Pastor Kristin presented a written report. Highlights pointed out were as follows: April 11th all Boards will meet to review their roles according to our constitution; calendar planning for 2023-2024; start working on a mission statement for Zion. There will be a June/July newsletter with another one in August. Pastor Kristin asked that all the boards have their meeting in August so that everything will be in place for when activities, etc. get started again in September. The Synod strongly suggests that each congregation form a Mutual Ministry Committee. There is a need to address a Stewardship Board. There are 21 students in the First Communion class. Pastor Kristin has been invited to lead a breakout session during the Pennington County "Towards Zero Deaths" presentation on Wednesday, April 26. March 18th is the Great Synod Get Together in Bemidji, MN.

<u>Silver Creek:</u> Clark Nelson represented Silver Creek and had nothing new to report.

<u>Parish Health:</u> Patty Schob presented a written report. Patty reported that sometime in April, Jennifer Johnson from Sanford Health will be a facilitator on Advanced Care Planning education. The public will be invited to attend with an announcement to be in The Times once a date is confirmed. Also, Johnson's Funeral Home has agreed to do a short presentation on pre-paid funeral arrangements and information related to their services. A tentative date is for mid-May.

<u>Worship Board:</u> Deb Fulton presented a written report. The board has discussed a new baptismal banner. The cost and size that would accommodate two names if needed was shared with the council. A motion was made to purchase the new baptismal banner using memorial funds. The motion was seconded and carried. Pathways Camp Sunday is March 26th. Palm Sunday is April 2nd. The service will be "The Cry of the Congregation". Maundy Thursday service is at 7:00 with communion and will also be first communion for 21 students. Good Friday service is at 6:30.

<u>Properties Board:</u> Mike Spears reported on the outdoor sign. The wait now is for spring for the electrical hook up. There was a nasty water leak in the old office, possibly due to the way the snow blew into a vent on the roof after the last big snowstorm.

Evangelism and Lay Ministry: Deb Holtan report for the board. Home communion is being offered to those members unable to attend church. The adult education series "Bright Shining as the Sun" has been moved to the fall due to a full spring schedule. On Palm Sunday the board is inviting the Sunday School children as well as their parents to take part in a small craft project in the fellowship hall following the church service. They will be able to take the project home with them that day. The 14th Annual Good Friday Prayer Vigil will on April 7th. New Member Recognition Sunday will be May 7th with an orientation on Thursday May 4th.

<u>Christian Ed and Youth:</u> Mike Flaagan reported the board has been discussing the confirmation program. The Hotdish Cook Off is Sunday March 26th. Money raised will go to updating the Youth Room. The 10th Graders will be doing the Sunrise Service at 7:00 Easter Sunday. The 6-8th Graders will be serving the breakfast that morning following the Sunrise Service.

Parish Fellowship: Glenice Johnson reported that the board did not meet.

<u>WELCA:</u> Glenice Johnson reported that the group met earlier today with an attendance of 21 ladies. The Lenten Suppers are well attended. There is no word

yet if there will be a Spring Conference. Zion is part of Conference 2. A decision was made to raise the fees for funerals by \$1.00 on each "menu" offered. A meeting will be held with Johnson's Funeral Home to revise the prices to reflect the change in the fees. Glenice stated that there are already 120 family members that will be attending the supper with the First Communion students on Maundy Thursday.

<u>Public Relations:</u> Darlene Hulteen reported that the first round of directory pictures went very well. The company has opened up more time slots for the May session.

After the board reports Pastor Kristin reported that the funds collected during the Food and Fellowship breakfast on the 19th is missing. Discussion was held on who should be responsible for seeing that the funds are secured.

\*The following Resolution Regarding Spring Flowers during the Easter Season was made and reads as such:

Whereas members and guests of Zion Lutheran experiences seasonal allergies and

Whereas many spring flowers are known allergens,

Be it resolved that members wishing to bring flowers for display of the Easter season be encouraged to bring Tulips, Azaleas, Orchids and Daffodils to adorn the sanctuary. These may be dropped off during the week between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday.

Be it further resolved, those planning to bring lilies may bring them on Easter Sunday morning before worship. They must be taken home immediately following the service. Any lilies brought prior to Easter Sunday morning or remaining after worship will be discarded.

Be it further resolved that flowers will only be placed in the chancel area.

Be it further resolved a third station for communion will be placed in the rear of the sanctuary for those who will wish to avoid the front of the sanctuary due to allergies.

A motion was made by Diane Lee to accept this resolution and was seconded by Renae Franke. The motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 7:03 pm after praying the Lord's Prayer.


