### SECOND READING: Romans 4:1-5, 13-17

<sup>1</sup>What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? <sup>2</sup>For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. <sup>3</sup>For what does the scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." <sup>4</sup>Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. <sup>5</sup>But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness.

<sup>13</sup>For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. <sup>14</sup>If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. <sup>15</sup>For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

#### GOSPEL: John 3:1-17

A curious Pharisee visits Jesus by night to learn from the teacher his friends reject. Jesus speaks to him about life in the Spirit and the kingdom of God. You are invited to hear this scripture in a new way through sharing in the reading of the Gospel. As Nicodemus comes to Jesus by night with his questions, you are invited to be his voice in the conversation. How often do we consider how we might talk with Jesus about our own thoughts and feelings?

Narrator: Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. <sup>2</sup>He came to Jesus by night and said to him,

Narrator: <sup>5</sup>Jesus answered, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. <sup>6</sup>What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. <sup>7</sup>Do not be astonished that I said to you, 'You must be born from above.' <sup>8</sup>The

wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." <sup>9</sup>Nicodemus said to him,

## People: "How can these things be?"

Narrator: <sup>10</sup>Jesus answered him, "Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things? <sup>11</sup>"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. <sup>12</sup>If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? <sup>13</sup>No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. <sup>14</sup>And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, <sup>15</sup>that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. <sup>16</sup>"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. <sup>17</sup>"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

**PARISH NURSE NOTES** - Let's face it, not everyone wants to, will, or can exercise on a regular basis and there may be many different reasons why this is so. But WOW, research is saying that sitting is the new smoking, truly a silent killer!

Too much sitting has been linked to higher risks of various health problems, especially cardiovascular disease. The average American spends 6-8 hours a day sitting. When you're sitting, you're not burning calories, so your body accumulated excess calories that deposit as fat. This in turn can cause elevation in blood pressure, sugar, and cholesterol which greatly raises risk for developing diabetes, heart disease, and strokes. Prolonged sitting can cause tight hips, back pain, osteoporosis, and clots in the legs.

Besides physical effects, it can take a mental toll as well. Mental health is dependent on exercise and being active so prolonged sitting can increase dementia and anxiety.

Studies have shown that those who consistently take a break after 30 minutes of sitting have lower mortality rates. This applies to those who do daily exercise routines too. Moving around at more regular intervals rather than just a once-a-day workout is suggested.

Some tips to stay moving....

**Set a timer.** Use phones, fitness tracker, watches, etc to alert you every 30 minutes. Take a break, stand up, walk around, or grab some water.

Stand up. If possible, use a desk that can be adjusted to various levels and stand for part of your day. Sit on a medicine ball. If you must sit, a ball can engage core muscles and avoid slouching.

Take the stairs. Avoid using the elevator when possible.

Do physical activities on a daily basis. Stretching, yoga, and flexibility training will keep your body healthy.

Stay active at home. When watching TV, get up and walk around during the commercials or shows. Walk while you work if possible. A desk treadmill can be a great way to squeeze additional steps into your day.
