# **Rogation Days -**

Stewardship of creation is an ongoing ministry in the church. The creation that God declared good is entrusted to the care of humankind. Exercising that care is one dimension of daily Christian discipleship. Rogation Days are a way for the church to honor God for the gift of creation and to pray for the land, the gift of labor, and the needs of all people. Rogation Days were traditionally



celebrated during the fifty days of Easter on the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday before Ascension Day. The word Rogation has its roots in the Latin word that means to ask or petition, and it comes from the ancient introit for the Sunday preceding the Ascension. In some places the celebrations of Rogation Days were quite elaborate and included processions from the church to and around fields while asking for God's blessing. We will use a liturgy for Rogation on **Sunday, May 7.** 



We will also welcome **NEW MEMBERS** into the congregation on **May 7**. God's Word goes out into the world and does not return empty. We celebrate those who have heard this Word and desire to make a commitment to our common work and witness at Zion where we know Christ and are sent

to make Christ known.

#### Zion Lutheran's Congregational Council Meeting April 18, 2023

The Congregational Council Meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 5:00 pm.

In attendance were President Laura Rude, Pastor Kristin Ostercamp, Denny Minks, Diane Lee, Renae Franke, Mike Spears, Mike Flaagan, Glenice Johnson, Darlene Hulteen, Marijo Nabben, Patty Schob and Deb Holtan.

President Laura Rude led the council in prayer.

The Secretary's Report from March 21, 2023 was presented. A motion was made to accept the minutes as printed. The motion was seconded and carried.

The Treasurer's Report for February with the corrected remaining budget balance was presented, along with the March Treasurer's report. Renae reported that the income for March was less then expenses and also pointed out the remaining budget for the Parish Nurse. Larger expenses are due to the purchase of grief books and as Madam President stated, this is the first time there has been a budget for the Parish Nurse, so adjustments for the upcoming budget planning will need to be made. The Treasurers Reports were filed for audit.

Youth Checking Account: A motion was made by Glenice Johnson to approve Mike Flaagan and Annette Lian as cosigners on the Youth Checking Account. The motion was seconded by Marijo Nabben. The motion carried.

<u>All Board Meeting:</u> Madam President asked for feedback from the council on last Tuesday's "all board meeting" that was led by Pastor Kristin. All agreed it was a very good meeting making us think "outside the box". There will be more meetings similar to this in the future.

**<u>Pastor's Report:</u>** Pastor Kristin's Reports was submitted. Highlights to her report are Sunday April  $30^{th}$  is a fifth Sunday of the month. There will be a

dedicated time for prayers for healing and anointing during worship. Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup> will be an observance of Rogation days. Beginning May 1<sup>st</sup> Pastor Kristin's regular days off will be Friday and Saturday. If there's an event where she needs to be called to serve, she will take compensatory time in the next week. There were 22 students who took First Communion on Maundy Thursday. Continuing Education will be on April 23-24 in Eden Prairie, MN. Also, Pastor Kristin reported she will be leading a breakout session during the Pennington County "Towards Zero Deaths" presentation on Wednesday April 26<sup>th</sup>.

**Zion's Foundation:** Madam President report that the Foundation has a full board of all new people. Their plan is to reorganize, and they are eager to start! A motion was made by Marijo Nabben to approve the following to be appointed members to Zion's Foundation board; Zac Svir, Amy Looker, Beth Nelson, Tracee Bruggeman, Shannon Boen and Paul Adams. The motion was seconded by Glenice Johnson, and the motion carried.

<u>Silver Creek:</u> No one present to represent them. Silver Creek will join Zion for worship on April  $30^{\text{th}}$ .

**Health Committee:** Patty Schob submitted their report highlighting the following. April 27, 2023, at 1:00pm in the Patio Room, Jennifer Johnson, Advanced Care Planning Facilitator from Sanford will be here to give a presentation on information about them. The Public is invited to attend with announcements going out in the paper and on KTRF.

**Worship Board:** Pastor Kristin reported that serving communion will go back to pre-covid with passing of the wafer and wine. Passing the offering plates was tabled until May's meeting.

**Properties Board:** Mike Spears reported they are getting pricing on new carpet in the entry by the offices. Also, pricing is being done for the rest of the hallways and outside the worship area. Mike said it looks as if they have done the locating for the directional boring for the electricity to the new sign.

**<u>Parish Fellowship:</u>** Glenice Johnson reported they are still working on the Sharing Servants Booklet updates. A letter with the new pricing for funeral meals was sent to Johnson's Funeral Home.

**WELCA:** Glenice Johnson reported they had 25/26 people today at their gathering. Their May meeting will be a prayer breakfast at 9:00 with a program. There are 12 graduating seniors from Zion. May  $3^{rd}$  will be a workday for tying/making the fleece blankets for these students. A planning meeting will be held in August for 2023-2024. Zion will be hosting the Synodical Meeting September  $9^{th}$ .

**Evangelism and Lay Ministry:** Marijo Nabben reported the Cross Craft Event with the Sunday School children went over very well! The board is planning something for the advent season with the Sunday School children. As of this meeting, there are 12 family units that have expressed interesting in joining Zion. Orientation for the new members will be at 7:00 on Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup>. We are asking that as many council members as possible attend this orientation. Recognition for the new members will be Sunday May 7<sup>th</sup> with cake being served in their honor during the fellowship hour.

<u>Christian Ed and Youth:</u> Mike Flaagan reported that they met on April  $4^{\text{th}}$ . Planning with the help of Pathways is being done for a VBS one day camp. Discussion continues on possible new plans for confirmation.

There's been no more word from the person working on the website. Darlene is asking that no personal cell numbers or email address be published on the website. The meeting was adjourned at 6:08 pm after praying the Lord's Prayer.
