Happy Thanksgiving to you and yours and God's Blessings Always!

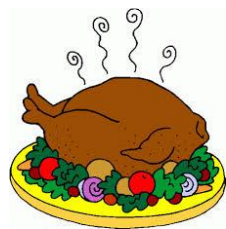

### Parish Planning Council Minutes October 15, 2019

The Parish Planning Council meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 5:31pm. In attendance were Laura Rude, Pastor John Golv, Pastor Ale Tulu, Barbara Overbye, Tim Numedahl, Lindsay Henrickson, Glenice Johnson, Jodi Bergman, Marijo Nabben, Dennis Yost and Deb Holtan.

Pastor John opened with a word of prayer.

The minutes from the September 17, 2019 meeting and the minutes from the special meeting held on October 7, 2019 were both presented. A motion was made to accept both minutes. The motion was approved.

**Treasurers Report:** Barbara pointed out that we are \$41,425.30 behind with our income. Barbara also reported the Redeemer will be handling the payroll for the new youth director. Zion will make the appropriate payment for its portion of the shared salary to Redeemer. Barbara stated a gift in the form of stocks was given to the church, but in order to receive this gift, an account was opened up through Pat Thibert’s office with Edward Jones.

The report was filed for audit.

**Silver Creek:** Nothing to report from Silver Creek other than the quilt raffle winner is to be announced at their dinner.

**Stewardship:** Dennis Yost asked the council how many people he should plan for to serve at the brunch on Sunday October 27th. Stewardship will be serving muffins, fruit, coffee, juice and milk for the meal. A postcard reminder is being sent out. The board is also planning to make phone calls between now and the end of the year inviting people to upcoming events in the church.

**Worship:** A report was submitted by Sharon Jorde. President Laura pointed out in Sharon's report that everything is in place for All Saints Sunday.

**Properties:** President Laura stated that Mike had nothing to report other than some water issues with all the rain that has fallen recently.

**Evangelism and Lay Ministry:** Marijo Nabben stated that New Member Sunday was postponed due to lack of interest. She stated that we need to let potential new members know that they can join at anytime. That New Member Sunday is in recognition of their membership. Anyone showing interest should contact Linda in the office so she can pass the information on to the pastors. The board has discussed different topics that can be presented during the occasional coffee time between services. One idea is on mental health, another is doing a mixer of some sort so as to get people to move around to different tables to visit. Marijo and Deb Holtan will be working on presenting "Effective Parenting in a Defective World" in the near future during the coffee hour between services. Kaylynn Wold will be joining the board as a new member.

**Christian Ed and Youth:** Lindsay Henrickson reported they had a K-5 Culinary Event the first part of October. November's event which will be led by Davina Brown and Becky Fredrickson which will be making ornaments. December's event the board is hoping to put together a hayride for the kids. Lindsay pointed out the Operation Christmas which is being handled by Amber Holtan.

**Parish Fellowship:** Glenice Johnson reported that their board is serving and organizing the "Pie with the Bishop" event on Sunday afternoon of October 27th. December's Sharing Servants still does not have a leader. The board will take that month.

**WELCA/ZLCW:** Glenice Johnson stated that she attended the NW Minnesota Synodical in Alexandria, Minnesota. The new president for this area is Marilyn Grandstrand from Karlstad. Marilyn asked if Zion would host in 2020 receiving a yes on the event. Glenice also reported that on Sunday, November 10 WELCA/ZLCW will be serving for the "Training Ears to Hear!" event being held here at Zion with Bishop Bill Tesch as the keynote speaker.

**Public Relations:** Jodi Bergman reported that the "Pie with the Bishop" will be on the church website along with the "Flapjacks for Faith." Spirit of Giving, Darlene Hulteen and Glenice Johnson are each applying for the Thrivent Choice Dollar cards to purchase new items for this event. One will be used for the purchase of new children's toys and the other to help with the advertising for this annual event.

**New Shared Youth Director:** The new Youth Director is Madison Crane from Crookston Minnesota. She will be invited to come on Sunday October 20th so the congregation can meet her. She will also be here Sunday October 27th.

**Pastor Ale:** Pastor Ale stated that it has been a "dry summer" as far as weddings go, and now there are three this fall! The Second Grade bible class is large with 25 registered and 22 attending. There are 16 students getting confirmed. Sunday October 27<sup>th</sup> the second graders will receive their bibles at the 8:30 service and confirmation will be at the 10:30 service. Bishop Bill Tesch will be here for both services.

**Pastor John:** Pastor John submitted his report. He said that Bishop Bill Tesch is calling the church to prayer with a prayer vigil for the area farmers to be held at Redeemer on Thursday October 17th at 7:00. Bishop Tesch has sent out the liturgy to area churches for the vigil.

**Call Committee:** President Laura stated that we need to start talking and thinking about this. What do we want the job description to be and what is this council's recommendation. With this, President Laura asked Pastor John to present the "Size Transitions in Congregations." The size of Zion's congregation is changing and this will have an effect on our decisions about calling a new pastor. Pastor Ale stated that we will have four Sundays remaining after the date of Pastor John's retirement that will be the two services on a Sunday here at Zion. He said with only one service during the summer months, it is possible for one pastor to handle the service here at Zion and still be able to service Silver Creek. If needed it is possible to get an interim pastor to help with Silver Creek. Pastor John stated that the number of people graduating from seminary right now is very low. President Laura stated that there will be a need for ongoing discussion about this.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 after saying the Lord's Prayer.

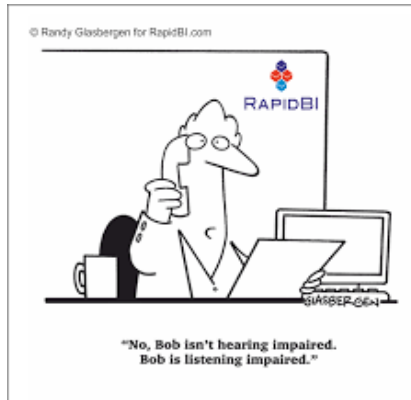

### Gift Suggestions:

- **TOYS:** dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.
- **SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** pens, pencils, sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.
- **PERSONAL CARE ITEMS:** toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, adhesive bandages (Colorful ones), (Do not include liquid antibiotic ointment.), reusable plastic containers: cup, water bottle, plate, bowl, (Consider filling an empty container with non-liquid items such as hair bows, sunglasses, or washcloths to maximize space.) blanket, non liquid lip balm, nail clipper, file, etc.
- **CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES:** t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.
- **CRAFTS & ACTIVITIES:** puzzles, binoculars, compass, chalkboard and chalk, sewing kit, fabric (1-2 yards), ribbon. Laminated decorative pictures with looped ribbon attached as a picture hanger, gardening kit with gloves and trowel (Do not include gardening seeds.), playing cards.
- **A PERSONAL NOTE:** You may enclose a note and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.
- **DO NOT INCLUDE:** Candy, toothpaste, gum, used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
  
- **PLEASE HAVE YOUR BOXES OR ITEMS DROPPED OFF AT THE CHURCH NO LATER THAN MONDAY, NOVEMBER 18.**
