The Season of Advent

Advent is the beginning of the Church Year. Advent begins on the fourth Sunday before Christmas Day. If Christmas Eve is a Sunday, it is counted as the fourth Sunday of Advent. This year

Christmas Day is a Sunday, so the fourth Sunday of Advent is the 18th, and the first Sunday of Advent is in November.

The Alpha and Omega is often used as an Advent symbol, "I am the Alpha and the Omega [the first and the last, the beginning and the end],' says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty" (Rev 1:8 and 22:13).

Alpha is the first letter of the Greek alphabet, and Omega is the last letter. Not only does this symbolize the One who has come and will come again, it also emphasizes the continuity of God's work in history throughout both the Old and New Testaments.

The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Thus, Advent is far more than simply marking a 2,000-year-old event in history. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ whereby all of creation might be reconciled to God. Scripture readings for

Advent reflect this emphasis on the Second Advent, including themes of accountability for faithfulness at His coming, judgment on sin, and the hope of eternal life.

In this double focus on past and future, Advent also symbolizes the spiritual journey of individuals and a congregation, as they affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in power. That acknowledgment provides a basis for Kingdom ethics, for holy living arising from a profound sense that we live "between the times" and are called to be faithful stewards of what is entrusted to us as God's people.

Historically, the primary sanctuary color of Advent is purple. This is the color of penitence and fasting as well as the color of royalty to welcome the Advent of the King. Purple is still used in some traditions. The purple of Advent is also the color of suffering used during Lent and Holy Week. This points to an important connection between Jesus' birth and death. The Nativity and the Incarnation cannot be separated from the crucifixion. The purpose of Jesus' coming into the world, of the "Word made flesh" and dwelling among us, is to reveal God and His grace to the world through Jesus' life and teaching, but also through his suffering, death, and resurrection. To reflect this emphasis, originally Advent was a time of penitence and fasting, much as the Season of Lent and so shared the color of Lent.

In recent times, however, Advent has undergone a shift in emphasis, reflected in a change of colors used in many churches. The penitential aspect of the Season has been reduced and an emphasis on hope and anticipation has been increased.

Most Protestant churches now use blue to distinguish the Season of Advent from <u>Lent</u>. Royal Blue is sometimes used as a symbol of royalty. Some churches use Bright Blue to symbolize the night sky, the anticipation of the impending announcement of the King's coming, or to symbolize the waters of Genesis 1, the beginning of a new creation.

Advent helps us to prepare for Christmas, the remembrance of Christ's birth. Let us remember the words of the angel this December, "Peace on Earth."

This Christmas Pauline and I wish to extend to you our hopes for a blessed Christmas for you and your family. And let us all remember that Jesus is "the reason for the season."


POINSETTIAS

It can be a comfort to just sit quietly. We can always be willing to listen. The pain of loss creates a deep and abiding loneliness, this is magnified when those grieving feel separated from others.

Second, we need to take our cues from our friend. If they need to cry and experience sadness, we need to be able to be with them without trying to "cheer them up". If they need reassurance of their worth, we need to be affirming. When they need to hear words of comfort from our Lord, we need to speak these to them.

Third, we need to remember them in our prayers and let them know we are praying for them. May we "comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God" (Corinthians.1:4)

Zion Lutheran's Congregational Council Minutes Tuesday November 15, 2022

The Congregational Council Meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 7:00 pm.

In attendance were President Laura Rude, Pastor Mark Helgeland, Denny Minks, Renae Franke, Penni Nelson, Mike Spears, Glenice Johnson, Deb Fulton, Darlene Hulteen, Patty Schob and Deb Holtan.

Pastor Mark led the council in prayer.

The Secretary's Report from October 18, 2022 was presented. Spelling corrections were made under Silver Creeks report. The word initiation should read invitation. Also under the Call Committee, the word reveled should read revealed. A motion was made by to accept the minutes with the corrections. The motion seconded. The motion carried.

The Secretary's Report for the Special Congregational Meeting from Sunday October 23, 2022, was also presented. A motion was made to accept the minutes as printed. The motion was seconded. The motion carried.

The Treasurer's Report was presented. The Nelson CDs renewed on October 25th at 2.7%. Renae pointed out that the money for the new AED came out of memorial funds/checking. Deb Fulton questioned the large amount taken from the budget for her board. This amount was for the pulpit supply for the summer months. Renae asked the council about a new computer for Pastor Kristen Ostercamp. Laura Rude said we will wait to see what Kristen wants.

Pastor Mark gave his report. In the last month he had performed one baptism, one funeral, had one counseling session, one hospital visit and one home visit. Pastor Mark announced his last Sunday preaching will be on Christmas Day.

Laura stated that we will need pulpit supply on Sunday January 1st. Kristen's first Sunday preaching will be Sunday January 8th.

<u>Silver Creek:</u> Penni Nelson reported Sunday December 4th will be their special Christmas service followed by a potluck dinner. Penni reminded Laura about finding a time to get the new contract in place.

<u>Health Committee:</u> Patty Schob submitted their report. Patty stated that Darlene Wiseth is glad to have her certification. Communion for the nursing homes is to be on the fourth Tuesday of the month, but this could change depending on Pastor Osterkamp's schedule. Nursery staffing was discussed. Tim Cook from Sanford TRF ambulance set up the new AED.

Recognition for Linda Hamrick: The "Thank You" gathering went very well! In continuing with the appreciation for all that Linda does for our church and congregation, a motion was made by Denny Minks to give Linda a \$2,000.00 bonus. The motion was seconded by Mike Spears. The motion carried.

Stewardship: The Pledge Cards are due by November 20th. Laura suggested no Temple Talk that Sunday due to such a busy service.

<u>Worship:</u> Deb Fulton reported that they will need someone to help with calling and finding readers for Sundays. Carol Narverud has been doing it for several years and wants to be done and pass the job on to someone else. The families for lighting the candles on the Advent wreath are lined up.

Properties: Mike Spears reported that the dumpster was filled. An electrician has been contacted to repair the lights in the canopies. Mike stated he had gone to the city meeting about the church's property tax. The parking lot was striped. He hasn't heard anything from the sign company. The wooden shelving in the old library will be removed. Christmas trees will go up on Friday November 25th.

Evangelism and Lay Ministry: Deb Holtan reported for Marijo Nabben. The first annual "Tree of Thanks" is up and there is much excitement to see the response to it. The board will be sending out Christmas cards at their December board meeting. The board will compare mailing lists with WELCA's list

<u>Christian Ed and Youth:</u> There wasn't anyone to represent the board. Laura Rude stated that the board's last event was cancelled due to lack of kids signing up for the event. Sunday December 18th is the Sunday School program which will include Little Lambs to 5th grade. Cornerstone Kids will also sing.

<u>Parish Fellowship:</u> Glenice Johnson reported that the Pie and Dessert Auction will be on Sunday November 20th. Proceeds will go towards the "Faith Fund". Glenice stated she went through the churches active list and found that there were around seventy names that are not in the Sharing Servants booklets. December's Sharing Servants still needs a leader.

<u>WELCA:</u> Glenice Johnson reported that the totals (from this spring and fall) on kits sent to Lutheran World Relief are: Personal kits-242; baby care kits-52; school kits-59 and quilts-26. Their December 13th meeting will be their "Christmas Tea". The group will also be providing cookies for the Holiday Train (as will other area churches) which will come to Thief River on Friday December 16th.

<u>Public Relations:</u> Darlene Hulteen submitted her report. The website is still being updated with information. Darlene asked if there should or could be a link to the church's constitution. Also links for the annual report, and council minutes. Paul Swanson, the rep for the new church directory has sent tentative dates for booking appointments for taking directory pictures. Those dates are February 28th through March 4th and May 9th through May 13th. Booking appointments will need to be done online. Pictures can be submitted. The board will reach out to those that are homebound or in nursing homes. There is a need for hosts and hostess during the days scheduled for picture taking. Darlene also stated that you do not have to be a member of Zion to have your picture in the directory.

Spirit of Giving: The committee has met, and things are in place. Spirit of Giving is December 3rd with more information to be announced in the upcoming bulletins.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm following the Lord's Prayer.
