

### FIRST READING: Isaiah 45:1-7

The prophet announces that Cyrus the Persian emperor is the one the LORD has anointed to end Israel's exile. The LORD makes this choice so that the whole world will recognize this LORD as the only God. Persia had a god of light and a god of darkness; the LORD claims sovereignty over both light and darkness.

<sup>1</sup>Thus says the LORD to his anointed, to Cyrus, whose right hand I have grasped to subdue nations before him and strip kings of their robes, to open doors before him—and the gates shall not be closed:

### **SECOND READING: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10**

Most likely this letter is the first written by Paul. Paul gives pastoral encouragement and reassurances to new Christians living in an antagonistic environment. Their commitment of faith, love, and hope makes them a model for other new Christian communities.

<sup>1</sup>Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,

To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace.

<sup>2</sup>We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers, constantly <sup>3</sup>remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>4</sup>For we know, brothers and sisters beloved by God, that he has chosen you, <sup>5</sup>because our message of the gospel came to you not in word only, but also in power and in the Holy Spirit and with full conviction; just as you know what kind of persons we proved to be among you for your sake. <sup>6</sup>And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for in spite of persecution you received the word with joy inspired by the Holy Spirit, <sup>7</sup>so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. <sup>8</sup>For the word of the Lord has sounded forth from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia, but in every place your faith in God has become known, so that we have no need to speak about it. <sup>9</sup>For the people of those regions report about us what kind of welcome we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols, to serve a living and true God, <sup>10</sup>and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom

**Handy Hands** - RSVP has not been able to utilize their **Handy Hands** program due to lack of volunteers. It's a great program and very much appreciated by the elderly who cannot do some of these minor things themselves. It's mission is to assist people age 60+ to remain safely and independently in their homes for as long as possible.

Parish Health has had 2 requests for this service in the past year that unfortunately couldn't be granted. We could utilize their idea and provide assistance to only our members if we could get some volunteers to help. Couple volunteers is an option too! Volunteers assist with small home repairs and maintenance projects and will know what is requested of them before making the repair visit.

Often it's a small request such as changing a light bulbs, checking on a broken recliner, securing something loose, repair a leaky faucet, fixing a smoke alarm, or maybe installing simple home safety equipment that can reduce falls. The home owner pays for all the material costs.

There's only one glitch here....we **NEED volunteers**. Please consider volunteering your services to help our elderly if needed. You can always decline a request if not comfortable with your skill level or the time it requires. It's a great feeling to help others, especially elderly, and it"ll probably just MAKE YOUR DAY! **PARISH HEALTH** Notes- It seems as though everyone is busy these days with little time to sit down for meals. However, eating as a family is important. Having meals together and dinnertime conversations help keep lines of communication open between everyone and helps your family bonding.

Keeping dinnertime conversation flowing can be done by...

- Asking open-ended questions. Ask questions like "Tell me about what you did at recess today," instead of questions like "How was your day today?" Open-ended questions get conversations started and could then lead to other topics.
- Don't interrupt. Be patient and attentive while your child is answering your questions. Avoid interrupting, as this may discourage the flow of his or her thoughts and stifle conversation.
- Reflect back. Use comments like "It sounds like you had a lot of fun today," or "That sounds like that made you really upset." These types of responses let your child know that you heard what was being said and you are paying attention and connecting with him or her in the conversation.
- Share your opinion, but don't lecture. Lecturing tones can make mealtime conversation tense, and your child may stop conversing with you at mealtime and altogether on a specific topic.
- ▶ Be prepared. Have a list of questions and conversation starters written down on a piece of paper, and ask a couple of them at dinner each night.
- Allow your child to ask questions as well.
- ▶ Share family memories and stories. Reminisce about good memories. This always gets the whole family laughing and smiling.
- Get rid of distractions. Turn off the TV, and leave your cell phones in a different room.


Don't force children to talk. If you feel there is something going on that you need to learn more about, save that for a private conversation at a later time.

These tips can help your family get to know each other better. If dinnertime doesn't work try breakfast. Whatever works best for your family is what is best. ENJOY YOUR MEAL!

Or if you would like to donate items you can do that also! There are drop off boxes throughout the church for your items. Monetary donations are also welcomed to help with shipping cost, or we can use the money to buy items to fill more boxes. A small shoebox can have a big impact. What goes into the box is fun, but what comes out of it is eternal. Be a part of changing lives through the power of a simple gift.

## **Gift Suggestions:**

**TOYS or a "WOW" item:** Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

**SCHOOL SUPPLIES:** pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring, and picture books, etc.

**PERSONAL CARE ITEMS:** toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, adhesive bandages (Colorful ones can help a child be more willing to wear a bandage. Do not include liquid anti-biotic ointment.), Reusable plastic containers: cup, water bottle, plate, bowl, (Consider filling an empty container with non-liquid items such

as hair bows, bracelets, sunglasses, or washcloths to maximize the space.) blanket, non-liquid lip balm, nail clipper and file, etc.

**CLOTHING & ACCESSORIES:** t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

**CRAFTS & ACTIVITIES:** Puzzles, Binoculars, Compass, Chalkboard, and chalk, Sewing kit, fabric (1-2 yards), and ribbon, Laminated decorative pictures with looped ribbon attached as a picture hanger, Gardening kit with gloves and trowel hand tool (Do not include gardening seeds.), Playing cards, Skipping rope/Jump rope

A PERSONAL NOTE: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.

DO NOT INCLUDE: Candy; toothpaste; gum; used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; seeds; fruit rolls or other fruit snacks; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
