LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Today we continue our celebration of Advent. On these four Sundays leading up to Christmas, we rejoice in the great gift that is ours in Jesus Christ.

We light the candles of the Advent wreath. The candles signify that Jesus is the Light of the World. The evergreens remind us that Jesus is life and brings life to us. All these are arranged in a circle because life in Christ has no end.

Each Sunday we light an additional candle. As we do, we remember that Christ has come to us. He is Immanuel...God with us. Today is the Second Sunday of Advent – the Sunday of Peace.

Our peace is found in God and Jesus Christ. John the Baptist, and all the prophets remind us that to receive peace, we must be prepared for it. We light this candle today to remind us that Christ is the Prince of Peace, the one promised from the beginning of the world. We thank God for the hope given to us and for the peace of God which passes all understanding.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 40:1-11

In grand, flowing, poetic lines, the prophet announces that the exile of God's people in Babylon is over. God will deliver Israel and will care for her as a shepherd cares for the sheep. This word can be trusted, because the only enduring reality in life is the word of God.

¹Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. ²Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

³A voice cries out:

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. ⁴Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. ⁵Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

⁶A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. ⁷The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. ⁸The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever. ⁹Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!"

¹⁰See, the Lord God comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. ¹¹He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep. SECOND READING: 2 Peter 3:8-15a

This short letter deals with pressing concerns regarding the final advent of Jesus, especially concerns that could arise over its apparent delay.

⁸Do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that with the Lord one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. ⁹The Lord is not slow about his promise, as some think of slowness, but is patient with you, not wanting any to perish, but all to come to repentance. ¹⁰But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and everything that is done on it will be disclosed.

¹¹Since all these things are to be dissolved in this way, what sort of persons ought you to be in leading lives of holiness and godliness, ¹²waiting for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be set ablaze and dissolved, and the elements will melt with fire? ¹³But, in accordance with his promise, we wait for new heavens and a new earth, where righteousness is at home.

¹⁴Therefore, beloved, while you are waiting for these things, strive to be found by him at peace, without spot or blemish; ^{15a} and regard the patience of our Lord as salvation. *Word of God, Word of Life...***Thanks be to God.**

PARISH HEALTH NOTES - Food safety is important before and after a holiday meal. With turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, and side dishes galore, meals are filled with tasty foods. But often those dishes stick around for much longer than a day. And while leftovers are as sought after as the big meal itself, meat and side dishes are only safe to eat for a certain amount of time.

Safely storing your leftovers....the US Department of Agriculture says to keep these tips in mind:

- ▶ Store leftover food in shallow containers no more than 2 inches deep.
- Refrigerate or freeze leftovers withing 2 hours.
- ▶ Set the fridge temperature between 33 and 40 degrees Fahrenheit, and your freezer at 0 degrees Fahrenheit or lower.
- Remove meat from the bone, and store it separate from the stuffing and gravy.
- Make sure you store any meat, eggs, veggies and milk within two hours.
- Throw any food left out at room temperature for longer than two hours.
- ▶ Discard any food you're unsure of being safe. WHEN IN DOUBT, THROW IT OUT!
- ▶ Reheat leftovers to 165 degrees Fahrenheit.

Whether you enjoy your leftovers as they are or use the ingredients to make new dishes, it's important to keep expirations dates in mind.

According to foodsafety.gov, a website of the U.S Department of Health and Human Services, the following foods are safe in the fridge.

Turkey should be eaten within 3-4 days of cooking. Another option is freezing it. It can last up to four months if frozen within the 2 hour window. Use stuffing and gravy within 2 days and side dishes up to five days after cooking, depending on the ingredients. The main reason to enjoy your leftovers before these time frames is bacteria. It can grow in your food. Bacteria and viruses found in food can cause food poisoning (or foodborne illness). You can prevent food poisoning by washing your hands often and cooking and storing food safely. Enjoy your holiday activities and all the eating we will be doing!!
