LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Today we continue our celebration of Advent. On these Sundays leading up to Christmas, we rejoice in the great gift that is ours in Jesus Christ.

We light the candles of the Advent wreath. The candles signify that Jesus is the Light of the World. The evergreens remind us that Jesus is life and brings life to us. All these are arranged in a circle because life in Christ has no end.

Each Sunday we light an additional candle. As we do, we remember that Christ has come to us. He is Immanuel...God with us. Today is the third Sunday of Advent – the Sunday of Joy. Our joy is in God and Jesus Christ. Like peace, joy is a gift from God. It overtakes us and fills us when we remember what God has done and what God has promised to do.

PARISH HEALTH NOTES — Coping with the holidays....Many bereaved persons dread the holidays as often it can be difficult to face the prospect of celebration while missing the individual they loved. Others may welcome the holidays, finding in them an opportunity for diversion as well as support as families and friends gather. Whatever one's perspective on the holidays is, it is important to avoid two strategies that are bound to fail. The first of these is to try to ignore the holidays. Another strategy which is equally poor is to keep the holidays just as they always were. This is bound to fail. After all, traditions cannot be the same. Someone loved is not there.

The holiday can be observed a bit differently. This can be done in a number of ways. For example, one can alter the traditional menu, celebrate in a different place, or add or subtract activities that were part of previous traditions. The fact is that the deceased person is often the uninvited guest. That individual is on everyone's mind. It can help as well to include the deceased within the holiday. Lighting a candle, offering a prayer in remembrance, or toasting the person are all ways that can be helpful in acknowledging the presence of that absence. This breaks the conspiracy of silence and offers opportunity for others to share memories, stories, and grief. Most importantly, share and communicate these ideas with all the others involved and when there is conflict, find compromise. The holidays may not be easy, but they can affirm that even in our grief, we can respond with thanks and gratitude for the gifts of the person we loved and have now lost.
