FIRST READING: Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

¹When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. ²And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." ³Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, ⁴"As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. ⁵No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. ⁶I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. ⁷I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you."

¹⁵God said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you shall not call her Sarai, but Sarah shall be her name. ¹⁶I will bless her, and moreover I will give you a son by her. SECOND READING: Romans 4:13-25

¹³The promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. ¹⁴If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ¹⁵For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation.

¹⁶For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, ¹⁷as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations")—in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist. ¹⁸Hoping against hope, he believed that he would become "the father of many nations," according to what was said, "So numerous shall your descendants be." ¹⁹He did not weaken in faith when he considered his own body, which was already as good as dead (for he was about a hundred years old), or when he considered the barrenness of Sarah's womb. ²⁰No distrust made him waver concerning the promise of God, but he grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God, ²¹being fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised. ²²Therefore his faith "was reckoned to him as righteousness." ²³Now the words, "it was reckoned to him," were written not for his sake alone, ²⁴but for ours also. It will be reckoned to us who believe in him who raised Jesus our Lord from the dead, ²⁵who was handed over to death for our trespasses and was raised for our justification. Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. ³³But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you

are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

³⁴He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. ³⁵For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. ³⁶For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? ³⁷Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? ³⁸Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels."

PARISH NURSE NOTES—

The healing power of prayer to lessen the effects of disease and speed recovery has been the focus of many scientific studies, and public opinion polls reveal that people believe in the healing power of personal prayer. Whether or not medical science offers proof of prayer linked to the healing process, what matters most is that you can experience God's compassionate healing with your or a loved one's illness. The healing power of prayer has many benefits even when a medical cure doesn't occur.

A few hints about prayer: Getting into the every day habit of prayer can change your very relationship with God—as an intimate friend who cares. Practicing daily prayer is a good idea. Pray for others as well as yourself.

Let prayer heal you. You may have feelings of anger or resentment for an illness that has occurred. Taking those feelings to God in prayer can help you release negative feelings and heal emotionally and spiritually, giving you strength to move forward. Do not be afraid to express anger, fear, resentment, disappointment, anxiety—or any emotion—in the presence of God; instead, see the expression as a very personal and intimate expression of prayer.

Explore other ways of healing. What happens to a person of faith who seeks healing and does not receive the cure he or she desperately sought? Have they been abandoned or forgotten by God? Perhaps the answer to such prayers is "no" to the wish for a cure but "yes" to another form of healing: trust, acceptance, and a new understanding of God's compassion and love.

"There is no doubt about the numerous benefits of prayer and spirituality: solace in times of suffering, uncertainty, and loss; a community of people who share one's values and beliefs; principles to help guide us through difficult situations. These benefits are helpful and healing in the deepest sense of the word." Barrie Cassileth, The Alternative Medicine Handbook
