# FIRST READING: Acts 4:5-12

Peter and John had been arrested the previous day because they were proclaiming the news of the resurrection to the people. In today's reading, Peter is filled with the Holy Spirit so that he can proclaim salvation in Jesus' name to the religious authorities.

<sup>5</sup>The next day [the] rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, <sup>6</sup>with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. <sup>7</sup>When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, "By what power or by what name did you do this?" <sup>8</sup>Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, "Rulers of the people and elders, <sup>9</sup>if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, <sup>10</sup>let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. <sup>11</sup>This Jesus is

'the stone that was rejected by you, the builders;

it has become the cornerstone.'

<sup>12</sup>There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved." Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.** 

#### SECOND READING: 1 John 3:16-24

Jesus' death on our behalf is the clearest demonstration of divine love. This is the very love we share with others, not just through our words but especially through our deeds. In sharing such love we fulfill God's commandments.

<sup>16</sup>We know love by this, that [Jesus Christ] laid down his life for us—and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. <sup>17</sup>How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

<sup>18</sup>Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. <sup>19</sup>And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him <sup>20</sup>whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. <sup>21</sup>Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; <sup>22</sup>and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

<sup>23</sup>And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. <sup>24</sup>All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us. Word of God, word of life. **Thanks be to God.**

#### GOSPEL: John 10:11-18

In language that recalls the twenty-third psalm, Jesus describes himself as the shepherd who cares for his sheep. He is willing to die for them, and he is able to overcome death for them.

The holy gospel according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus said:] <sup>11</sup>"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup>The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. <sup>13</sup>The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. <sup>14</sup>I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, <sup>15</sup>just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup>I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. <sup>17</sup>For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. <sup>18</sup>No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

#### PARISH NURSE NOTES —

Do you feel shame or guilt when you make a mistake or when life fails? We are all hard on ourselves and that is reality. However, no one has shamed and guilt their way to better health. Self-compassion is an art that is feared by many and lost on most.

Matthew 22:39 tells us that the second greatest commandment is to love others as ourselves. But how many of us honestly say that we show ourselves the love that we know God expects us to show others? Week after week, we sit in pews and listen to messages that convict and inspire our heart to show compassion to others. But we remain ignorant and uncaring to the importance of showing compassion to ourselves.

There are many reasons, circumstances, or situations that may lead us to a lack of self-compassion. The negative, abusive relationship with ourselves is not pleasing to God, nor is it acceptable in the life of a Christian. When we live this way, we are not living in light of Truth. We are walking in the darkness of false expectations and misplaced confidence.

A few steps you can take toward creating a heart of self-compassion and a God-honoring relationship with yourself....

Accept Yourself. Learning self-acceptance is an important part of practicing self-compassion.

Accepting yourself simply means coming to terms with what is. Accepting what is serves a good point for growth.

Navigating Roadblocks. No matter how hard we try to ignore the less-than-pleasant pieces of ourselves, God still sees them. And they will continue to affect our lives until they are dealt with.

God does not want us to live a life of ignorance and denial. He wants us to evaluate ourselves, come to terms with who we are, and embrace our identity in Him.

Make Time For Yourself. Another way to practice self-compassion is to make time to tend to our mental, emotional, and spiritual health. Our internal, spiritual, emotional, and mental health is every bit as important as our external physical health. A simple way to take care of these easily forgotten internal needs is to make time for rest and reflection.

The Need For Rest. Constant busyness leaves no time for rest. Rest is an essential part of life! God built rest into the fabric of our design. Allowing our body and mind to rest is not only a beautiful act of self-compassion but also surrender to God's design.

The Importance of Self Reflection. This gentle act gives us permission to be gentle, flexible, and patient with ourselves as we work to grow in both our personal and spiritual lives.

Forgive Yourself. We cannot feel or show true compassion to others without first forgiving them. Similarly, we cannot have true self-compassion without engaging in self-forgiveness.

The Gif Of Grace. If you believe that God is in control, then you must agree that He is in charge of the consequences of our actions. Psalm 103:12 assures us that God removes our sins as far from us as the east is from the west. Through the freedom of his forgiveness we can learn to see ourselves through the lens of His grace and mercy.

Remember The Truth. Self-compassion isn't just something nice to do for yourself. It's a necessary act of obedience to the word of God. The better we get at muffling the loud voice that

tells us we are not enough, the better we'll be able to hear the still, small voice of God that reminds us that we are complete in Him!
